Points System for the Evaluation of the National Higher Education Scholarship (maximum 150 points)¹

I. Studies in the Last Two Semesters – maximum 50 points

NORMAL GRADE POINT AVERAGE, IF ABOVE 4.0 AND AT LEAST 30 CREDITS COMPLETED PER SEMESTER, WITH NO DROPPED COURSES (MAX. 50 POINTS): $(\text{AVERAGE} - 4) \times 50$ POINTS

Other academic excellence (maximum 25 points):

- * Best in group for a course in one semester: credit value / 2 points
- * Significantly outstanding performance in a course (across several years' comparison) +5 points
- ** Extraordinary performance ++5 points
- * Project papers, essays 3 points
- ** Other professional or academic competitions maximum 6 points

LANGUAGE EXAMINATIONS (MAXIMUM 15 POINTS):

Basic level "C" 2 points

Intermediate "C" 5 points

Intermediate "A" or "B" 3 points

Advanced "C" 10 points

Advanced "A" or "B" 5 points
